NHTSA: Teen Unsafe Driving Behaviors

The National Organization for Youth Safety (NOYS) has been working with the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) to identify strategies for counteracting these dangerous driving behaviors among teenage motorists and passengers. The purpose of this project is to support these efforts by identifying messages and communication strategies that are likely to affect teenage driving behaviors. The steering committee was asked to define the parameters of the project and to develop recommendations on how the project should proceed. The results of this meeting were summarized in a summary report, delivered to NHTSA in February 2004.

In 2005, the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) Highway Safety Committee established the Impaired Driving Subcommittee (IDSC) to work with NHTSA, the Governor's Highway Safety Association (GHSA), and Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) to determine how we can substantially reduce impaired driving in the United States and Canada, and the associated traffic fatalities and injuries caused by impaired driving.

The Subcommittee then decided on two deliverables. The first is this Guidebook that is intended to serve as a guide to law enforcement executives on how to most effectively renew their efforts to eliminate impaired driving on our roadways.

Consistent Enforcement Produces Positive Results for La Crosse, Wisconsin

In 2005, the La Crosse Police Department in Wisconsin began conducting compliance checks aimed at reducing the availability of alcohol to underage youth. Attached is their story. During the checks, if the minor successfully purchased alcohol, the officers immediately issued citations to both the seller and the establishment's owner (i.e., the alcohol license holder). If the minor was denied the sale, the officers informed the seller and the owner that they successfully passed the compliance check. To show its appreciation, a follow-up letter was also mailed to the business owner from the Chief of Police praising the sales clerk and the business for not selling alcohol to an underage person.
