<p><b>Committee reports</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Law and Policy</b> –Terry Vandergrift (State’s Attorneys Office)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Survey reports provided to LCCPA 6/14/11 - Terry Vandergrift was not present, so Kim shared that the results of the survey reports would be posted on the LCUDPTF website and she would send out the link to Task Force members.</li> <li>○ State Legislation - Chief Rose brought up the Deerfield case involving underage drinking (Hutsell) and how it has affected the passing of legislation in Springfield. He further stated Cullerton was blocking the bill. Kim wondered what we as a Task Force could do to? There was much discussion. Peggy brought up contacting new Senator Suzi Schmidt to see if she could sponsor the movement. However, Chief Rose believes she is too new to the Legislature to make a large push. He suggested maybe Garrett or Link. Chief Rose also suggested contacting the Daily Herald to do a feature story on the issue. He also pointed out this would be under the umbrella of the Task Force, as to shift the focus off municipalities and avoid backlash. Kim reminded the group that as a Task Force we have to educate and not lobby. How to navigate this balance is difficult, so the issue of a State Legislation policy will be discussed at our Strategic Planning Meeting.</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Enforcement</b> – David Belmonte (Lake Bluff P.D.) and Rick Wilk (Deerfield P.D.)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Prom season compliance checks - Rick asked that all departments get their compliance check results to him by the end of the week. He stated Antioch, Buffalo Grove, Deerfield, Highland Park, Lake Bluff, Lake Forest, Lake Villa, Lake Zurich, Mundelein, Vernon Hills, Wauconda and Winthrop Harbor have all turned theirs in. Grayslake and Riverwoods will be turned in soon and Zion's was delivered today at the meeting. Once all results are in a press release will go out. Next compliance check is planned for the fall during Homecoming season. Peggy brought up the issue of acknowledging those establishments who have passed a compliance check with a certificate or letter. There was much discussion regarding this issue. Once issue brought up was the results can change from check to check. Chief Rose also mentioned that Mundelein sends out a letter whether the establishment as passed or failed. As for the letter idea, Dave offered to send out letters from the Task Force if Departments provided him with those that pass.</li> </ul>
