Data Review	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• IYS Summary of 2010 Lake County results<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Underage drinking – highest○ Marijuana use - second• Summary of 2010 Law Enforcement survey<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Compliance checks - 59% do quarterly; 72% by LCUDPTF members; 76% publish results; most officers trained via workshops/ training.○ Social Host ordinances (SHO)– 81% responding have a SHO, 90% indicate LCUDPTF was catalyst; most components left out: including ‘other drugs’ & ‘protection for the host if they contact police for assistance’• Summary of 2011 Law Enforcement follow up social host survey<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ 88% municipalities responded• Current strategic plan
Priorities	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• <u>Underage Drinking</u> – continues to be the ‘drug of choice’ (IYS Data); missing the 18-20 y/o group data – this could be a great need to address as many coalitions are working with parents. Source of alcohol – retail not indicated on IYS, however continuing with compliance checks will keep this number low.• <u>Prescription Drug</u> – while not an indicator on the IYS (very low reporting), school counselors, treatment centers, etc are reporting an increase of use. We have started looking at ‘disposal’ process as many Lake County Law Enforcement agencies have become collection sites. There is a readiness to coordinate efforts of transport or local disposal site.• <u>Marijuana</u> – while the number of youth reporting marijuana use (past 30 day) seems to be rising, collaborative efforts for prevention are challenging. At this point, we (LCUDPTF) may not have the capacity to effectively address youth marijuana use.• <u>Heroin</u>: there have been several heroin overdose deaths in Lake County in the past couple years. There has been little/no collaborative effort to address heroin use. While the IYS numbers don’t seem to indicate growing use, related crime is becoming alarming. There may be an opportunity for the LCUDPTF to assist in gathering people to the table to address this health problem.
